The CHC encourages submissions that are relevant to the proposed amendment and address matters mentioned in section 52E of the *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*.

Members may wish to note proposals for:

- Thymol Proposal for a new Schedule 6 entry for thymol; and
- Vitamin D Proposal to a new Schedule 3 entry to allow a weekly dose of Vitamin D up to 175 micrograms (7000IU) per recommended dose. Proposal to also include Schedule 3 Vitamin D in Appendix H.
