### Department of Agriculture Imported Food Inspection Data January - June 2013

#### High compliance rates for imported foods

Results of tests applied to food imported to Australia show a consistently high rate of compliance with Australia's strict food standards. However, the latest report shows food labelling accounted for most instances of non-compliance with Australia's imported food requirements.

This report is released twice a year and details the types of food tested, how frequently they're tested, the level of compliance and the country of origin.
