Reversal of decision regarding Astragalus membranaceous

!Members are advised not to change the label name of Astragalus membranaceous.

Background

In June 2018, the TGA changed the ingredient name from Astragalus membranaceous to Astragalus mongholicus, providing an 18 month transition period for sponsors.

The name change and transition period were provided within the Therapeutic Goods (Permissible Ingredients) Determination No. 2 of 2018 on 15 June 2018.

Reversal of Amendment.

Subsequently the TGA received information that the new name is not consistent with the taxonomical classification in the herbal reference naming standard, the Medicine Name Plant Service (MPNS) database, where the botanical species Astragalas membranaceous and Astragalus mongholicus are not synonymous.

Consequently, the ingredient name AAN will revert back to Astragalus membranaceous in the new Permissible Ingredients Determination in early September 2018.

What you need to do:

- If you have a listed medicine with this ingredient and your medicine label(s) read Astragalus membranaceous, no action is required.
- If your listed medicine label(s) carry the name Astragalus mongholicus, you are required to amend your label as soon as practicable.

The TGA will not pursue any compliance matter regarding related label amendments until after 1 January 2020.
