It is not intended to replace reference to legislative documents when developing and maintaining products, but as a useful summary and general reminder of upcoming transition dates. ## Using the TGA Assessed logo on LA & R medicines – now in effect

The TGA have released the requirements and legislation supporting the use of the TGA Assessed claimer for AUST L and AUST R medicines. There are two AUST R complementary medicines that are now implementing the claimer for their labels:

(2) "Evidence for the approved indications has been assessed by the TGA."

Label use: The use of the logo on a label is dependent upon agreement by the TGA during either the initial medicine evaluation, or following a request for variation under section 9D of the Act.

All use: The use of the TGA assessed claim on advertisements or labels must be in accordance with the requirements set out in the Guidelines. These guidelines provide:

- Requirements for location, font and other style requirements
- That either of the above 2 claimer items cannot be used in an advertisement, except as part of a pack shot.
- The advertising must not imply that the TGA recommends the medicine or advocates the use of the medicine above other medicines that do not use the TGA assessed claim.
